More Walk-in Appointment Spots at CLE clinic starting Monday

Starting Monday July 5, 2021, walk-in appointment spots will be available at the Thunder Bay District Health Unit (TBDHU) CLE clinic in Thunder Bay. Anyone 12 years of age and older will be eligible to receive a first or second dose of COVID-19 vaccine without having a pre-booked appointment.

Additional walk-in spots are being put in place to increase access to vaccine and to make it more convenient for individuals to get immunized. People wanting a walk-in appointment can attend the clinic in-person [during specified hours](#). No pre-registration or booked appointment is required. The clinic generally operates 6 days a week with morning, afternoon and early evening times available. TBDHU will be using both the Coliseum building and the Heritage building on the CLE grounds to accommodate walk-ins.

For walk-in spots, TBDHU will have measures in place to manage an influx of people and can move people through efficiently. Depending on the number of people who show up, individuals who do choose to attend the clinic as a walk-in can expect to wait in line; therefore, this option may not be suitable for those who cannot stand or wait for long periods. The number of walk in appointments available daily will be based on vaccine supply and the number of pre-booked appointments.

Individuals with pre-booked appointments will continue to be seen at their scheduled time. TBDHU will also continue to use a [daily back-up list](#) to as a means to use remaining doses at the end of the day. This back-up list is also used for the hospital-run COVID-19 vaccine clinic at the Thunder Bay Regional Health Sciences Centre (TBRHSC) Bora Laskin building on the Lakehead University campus. Individuals can register for the daily back-up list and will be contacted directly as needed by TBDHU or TBRHSC to come to a clinic for vaccination.

In the District communities, the local Family Health Teams continue to deliver vaccine clinics, using the expanded criteria. For individuals in the District, please visit the [TBDHU website](#) for additional information and links to the Family Health Teams

In addition to COVID-19 immunization clinics, individuals can also arrange for appointments at [select pharmacies](#) in the TBDHU area.

Position Title: Community Health Representative (CHR)

Position Description: Fort William First Nation (FWFN) requires a CHR to be responsible for the support, education and advocacy of health and health care within the community. The CHR will possess strong knowledge of various health prevention and treatment practices including, but not limited to, traditional and herbal approaches.

Major Responsibilities:

- Participate in the research, development and maintenance of community health policies.
- Provide health care and prevention education within the community including schools, community centers and patient homes.
- Liaise between patients, families and the community to ensure patients are informed of their condition(s) and prescribed treatment(s), and are receiving quality care.
- Liaise with health care providers in an effort to remain current with health issues.
- Perform health care treatments as necessary and within capacity.
- Perform frequent and accurate patient evaluations and respond appropriately.
- Coordinate care with clinics, outside health care providers and hospitals.
- Educate and guide patients in how to perform tasks they can do themselves.
- Other duties, relevant to the position, shall be assigned as required.

Are you laid off, collecting EI, but about to run out or has run out, or have you been receiving The Canada Recovery Benefit (CRB) which will be reduced \$300/week starting in July you may be eligible to to work for The Friends of Chippewa Park?

We are seeking 4 individuals for work in painting, carpentry and general labour assignments until September 30, 2021. Pay is \$570 per week.

Benefits of the Positions: the program is designed to assist the participant in developing and maintaining skills that will increase their chances of finding more permanent work. The benefit to TFOCP is in the improving of facilities at Chippewa Park.

Eligibility: a person must either be currently receiving or eligible to receive employment insurance benefits , have made a claim for EI or your EI period ended within the past three years or have received EI maternity or parental benefits in the past five years and are re-entering the workforce.

Wages: if you are currently receiving EI benefits those will continue while on the JCP and until your normal EI benefit period runs out, then for the remainder of the 13 weeks you will continue to receive your EI benefits. For example if you have 8 weeks left on EI, you will receive an additional 5 weeks of benefits while participating in the JCP.

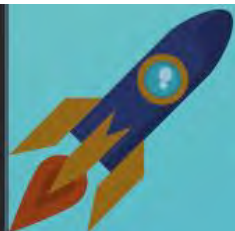
