Enforcement

As most in our community have noticed an increase in bear activity. Here are a few tips to help reduce bear encounters.

Garbage:

- put garbage out only on the morning of garbage day, not the night before
- put meat scraps in the freezer until garbage day
- put garbage in containers that have tight-fitting lids and store it in a bear-proof location such as your basement or a sturdy garage
- frequently wash garbage cans and recycle containers and lids with a strong-smelling disinfectant, such as bleach

Barbecue:

- burn off food residue and wash the grill right away
- empty the grease trap every time you barbecue
- remove all utensils, dishes and food after eating

Fruits and berries:

- pick all ripe and fallen fruit from trees and shrubs on your property
- plant non-fruit bearing trees and shrubs

Pet food:

• do not leave pet food outdoors, in screened-in areas or porches

NOTICE TO COMMUNITY- Electronic Voting

Our Chief and Council have approved our voting system to move toward electronic voting for upcoming vote requirements. With this direction, Fort William First Nation will be working with OneFeather (onefeather.ca) to set up online electronic voting and community engagement solutions. The upcoming votes to use OneFeather technology will be:

- FWFN Specific Claims Housing Trust Youth Trust Payments
- FWFN Lands Code

This will allow more accessibility for band members to participate in our governance and will represent our First Nation moving toward with modern technology. Band members will be required to create a OneFeather profile following the steps below. Setting up your profile is easy, safe and your personal data is secure and protected. It will only take a few minutes to complete this process. Other traditional paper voting solutions will remain in place for those members who do not have access to smart Edevice technology (phone, tablet or computer) and who may not have a personal email address.

OneFeather has set up a quick engagement event to get you started and activate your profile. You will require a personal email address, your status card number and date of birth. Click the RED button at the link below. Click the RED button - you will be guided through the activation process – it should only take a minute or two.


THE ORANGE ABINOOJIINH MOVEMENT (OAM)

The Orange Abinoojiinh Movement (OAM) are a grass roots organization that began its journey when the graves of 215 indigenous children were uncovered at a residential school in Kamloops, BC. We don't know for certain that these children were given at very least a prayer. It was with that reality the OAM decided to hold a sacred fire where OAM could remember and honor those children. This has resulted in a continuous safe space for indigenous people to gather together and heal in solidarity. The fire has been burning for well over 90 days, and will continue to burn till October 1st.




